2. PLEDGE TO THE FLAG

Mr. Kiehle led the pledge to the flag.

3. REQUEST TO SPEAK

Frank DeSorbo, a community advocate for Korean and Viet Nam veterans, addressed the Board regarding the Alternative Veterans' Exemption. The tax exemption is available on the residential property of a Veteran who has served during a designated time of war or received an expeditionary medal.

Mr. Kiehle thanked Mr. DeSorbo for bringing this item to the Board's attention and thanked the Veterans for their service. He also noted that the District actively supports the Veterans who reside in the South Colonie community.

Mr. Buhner stated that the Board has taken this issue seriously over the past few years and is looking at the budget to determine if adopting the exemption would be reasonable for all taxpayers.

Ms. Fisher stated that the timeline for adoption is very tight as the District would be required to hold a Public Hearing and adopt a resolution prior to the March 1 deadline.
