**Proposition #2 – School Bus Lease**

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Chapter 472 of the Session Laws of 1998, the Board of Education of the South Colonie Central School District, Albany County, New York, is hereby authorized to lease and expend therefore, including costs incidental thereto and the financing thereof, an amount not to exceed the estimated maximum cost of three hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$350,000.00), and for a term not to exceed five (5) years, the following motor vehicles: two (2) 66-passenger buses, one (1) 30-passenger bus, two (2) 16-passenger buses, and that such sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said school district and collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the New York State Education Law; and that in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said school district shall be issued.
