Involves students in recycling and environmental issues.



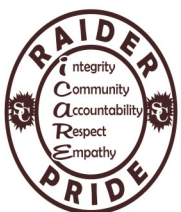
### \*GSA ~ Mrs. Hecht & Mrs. Lukasik

This club intends to help English Language Learners (ELL) integrate into extra-curricular activities and transition culturally and socially into school life and introduce American students to different cultures.



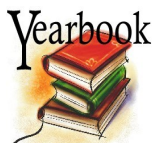
### National Honor Society ~ Mrs. Clayton
