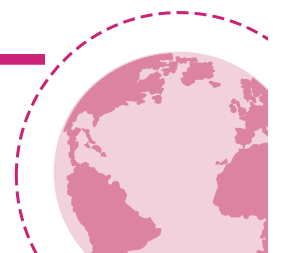

### ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

#### ENGLISH

Honors courses are available in grades 9-10. Advanced Placement courses begin in grade 11 with AP Language and Composition. Students may further their AP coursework as seniors with AP Literature and Composition or choose to take classes in conjunction with SUNY-Albany and Hudson Valley Community College for college credit.

#### FOREIGN LANGUAGE

Cooperative college credit courses in French and Spanish are available through SUNY-Albany. Introductory college classes in Italian are also available to students in conjunction with Hudson Valley Community College.

#### MATHEMATICS

Two Advanced Placement courses are available in calculus.

#### SCIENCE

Advanced Placement courses are available in biology, chemistry and physics.

#### SOCIAL STUDIES

Advanced Placement courses are offered in World History, U.S. History and Western European History. In addition, college credit is offered in sociology and psychology following successful completion of the College Level Examination Program or completion of the Hudson Valley Community College courses taught at CCHS. College credit in macroeconomics is available through HVCC.

#### TECHNOLOGY, ART, MUSIC, BUSINESS

Several classes are available to students in conjunction with HVCC. These include Design and Drawing for Production, Video Art, Web Art and Design, Computer Programming, Music Appreciation, Art History and Automotive courses. Graphic Art courses for college credit available through Adirondack CC.

*Note: Curricula in general engineering and bio-medical engineering are offered through the nationally recognized pre-engineering program, Project Lead the Way.*
